School Based Health Clinic Basic Service Plan

- ***Preventative Care: Well child checks, sports physicals and immunizations, including health education for students and parents.***
- ***Acute Health Care: Diagnosis and treatment of sudden onset conditions, referrals and follow-up visits as necessary.***
- ***Chronic Condition Care: Monitoring and treatment of student's chronic medical needs based on diagnosis and condition.***
- ***Behavioral Health Services: Behavioral health assessment, treatment and medication management.***
